WHAT'S NEW?

Our summer camp programing has been changed and improved to assure the best quality program for all participants. With new regulations set by Miami-Dade County, we have formed a new approach that will be implemented in this year summer camp:



SAFETY is our first priority! We will be implementing strict regulations for our facility, staff, apprentices, campers and guests. We have implemented a smaller camp, with smaller ratios and strict sanitation procedures.


SCIENCE, RESEARCH, DISCOVERIES & ADVENTURES: Camp themes will be included in EVERY week of the camp. Campers will be able to experience outdoor adventure, science and nature, and research in each week of camp. This approach ensures that indoor activities are kept to a minimum, maximizing regulated outdoor activities that are less risky.





CAMPERS AND PRICE

To regulate the number of people occupying our facility space, we will be accepting 24 campers per week. With 6 campers allocated to each team, we will be able to have 3 staff with the campers and 8 apprentices to assure quality. This number of campers and staff ratios will ensure safe one on one safety procedures and quality time in each activity. The price of the camp will be \$465.00 per camper. ALL SALES ARE FINAL and NO REFUND will be issued.

WEEK 5: July 15-19 WEEK 6: July 22-26 WEEK 7: July 29-Aug 2


Each week will have similar schedules with activities varying weekly. We will ensure that no two weeks will be the same, allowing your camper more opportunities to join the adventure!

APPRENTICES AND PRICE -

To ensure quality in our program, we will be accepting **8 apprentices per week**. This number of apprentices will ensure safe procedures and quality time in each activity. The price of the camp will be **\$265.00 per apprentice per week**. ALL SALES ARE FINAL and NO REFUND will be issued. Ages for apprentices are **13yrs** and up. *ONLY TRAINED APPRENTICES ARE ALLOWEDTO PARTICIPATE IN CAMP*.



REQUIRED TRAINING DAYS

All apprentices will be required to participate in a training in where they will be equipped with techniques, procedures, and safety protocols in order to participate as an apprentice during the camp program. This training is included in the camp fee. Apprentices could not participate in the camp without training.

WHAT TO BRING

Here is a list of items that you will NEED to bring in order to attend the camp.

- Nature Postings Summer Camp Shirt (Provided on the first day of camp)
- Lunch (No Nut Policy) in a separate lunch box. (No microwave is available)
- Refillable water bottle.
- ALL BIKES ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A PLACE TO HOLD WATER BOTTLE.
- Sunscreen & Bug Spray (Applied prior arrival and add additional in Lunch box)
- Bicycle and Helmet
- Hat
- Towel
- Bathing Suit
- Change of Clothes, including underwear, socks , shoes, etc.
- Closed toe shoes (NO CROCS)
- Water shoes (NO CROCS)
- Any medication required need to be placed in a labeled plastic zip-lock bag and be given to team captain counselor. Counselors are not allowed to administrate medications.
- Plastic bag for wet clothes after water activities
- <u>ALL CAMPERS MUST HAVE EXPERIENCE BIKING</u>. Our campers bike up to 10 miles a day. No training wheels are recommended. Training wheels are accepted if the camper can ride up to 10 miles with it.

The following items are recommended, but not required:

- Rain Jacket or Poncho
- Extra Snacks (Especially for campers with Food Allergies)



RULES

Please read all summer camps rules. These rules will be discussed the first day of camp:

- **1.** RESPECT | Campers must respect all staff, apprentices, campers, animals, nature and property
 - Follow Directions at all time. Directions are given at the beginning of each activity.
 - Keep your hands, feet and objects to yourself. Do not throw any object.
 - No cursing or foul language is permitted at camp.
 - Clean up after yourself. Take only memories, leave only footprints.
 - NO electronics, cell phones, games or toys are allowed at camp.

2. ATTIRE & BELONGINGS | Campers wear appropriate attire and bring the appropriate belongings

- Camp shirt is required every day. Additional shirts will be available for sale for \$40
- Lab coat are required at all times indoors. Safety gear will be required in some activities.
- Closed –toed shoes are required for all activities
- Sun Screen and Bug Spray must be applied before entering the facility.
- Safety Gear is mandatory during outdoor activities. (helmets, lifejackets, etc.)

3. TEAM | Campers must stay with teams and counselors to ensure safety

- Follow the number system to account for all campers
- Whistles signals: 1 whistle = STOP, 2 whistles = COME and 3 whistles = EMERGENCY.

4. CONSEQUENCES | Campers who fail to follow rules above will be subject to the following.

• Three Strike Rule: Campers who fail to follow rules will have three opportunities to correct their mistakes. After each misdemeanor, a strike will be given to the camper and a meeting will take place with the camper and the appropriate guardian. If a camper is given three strikes in one week, they will be sent home with no refund.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Please read all summer camps rules. These rules will be discussed the first day of camp:

- GOOD BREAKFAST: It is very important that your child eats good breakfast rich in protein and whole grains before arriving to camp. Due the intensity of the activities, we need our campers ready for action with a good breakfast.
- CAMP SHIRT: We are providing a camp shirt FREE each week. Campers need to wear the shirt every day for easy identification and group control during outdoors activities. Additional camp shirts are available for sale for a cost of <u>\$40</u>.
- CAMP HOURS: Camp hours are 8:30 AM- 5:00 PM. Parents will be required to sign in/out their child during drop off and pick up. Only the people authorized in the registration form will be allowed to pick up campers. ID is required during pick up.
- ARRIVE ON TIME: We required all campers to arrive by 8:30am. We have prepared a busy schedule that requires travel on bikes to different locations. We will depart for outdoor adventures on time.
- WEATHER: All activities are subject to weather. We will notify parents in the morning if any of the adventures have been changed or modified.
- HOW TO REACH US: Most of the activities will be outdoors, please note we will be biking, kayaking, snorkeling, etc. with no direct access to our phone. If you need to reach out any of our counselors, please <u>TEXT</u> us at the mobile number <u>(786) 608-3603</u>. We will respond as soon as possible.
- **BIKES AND HELMETS**: Bikes and helmets are required every day. We keep campers bikes locked. We are not responsible for stolen bikes or bikes left in the properties at night. All bikes have to leave after each day and come back the next day.
- BIKE WATER HOLDER OR BASKET: To minimize the contact of among water bottles, bikes are required to have a water bottle holder or basket. Camel Water Bags are *NOT* allowed!
- **PHOTOS**: After each day, we will be postings photos on our Instagram page. Please like our page and enjoy the adventures from home!


